



Understanding Fractions

This course is aimed at learning support assistants and HLTAs but teachers who have identified fractions as a gap in their subject knowledge will benefit including NQTs and RQTs. It is created as three progressive sessions during the first half of the academic year in order to build on successes and address challenges.

The Key Stage 2 Mathematics test has a greater focus on fractions year on year. Children and adults generally find this area of mathematics hard to learn and how to teach.

We will look at the progression in all elements of fractions from year 1 year 6. The aim of this course is to upskill adults, who will be working with children to support them with gaps in learning, with how to:

- understand fractions as numbers and as operators
- understand how fractions, decimals and percentages are linked
- make fractions, decimals and percentages understandable and accessible to pupils
- recognise and address common (and not so common) misunderstandings and misconceptions for fractions, decimals and percentages
- prepare and deliver sessions for the teaching of identified gaps in FDP
